**Which type of disruptive schedule is applied for air operators**

## under EASA oversight?

### Answer

In accordance with point ARO.OPS.230 of the Air Operations Regulation ([Regulation \(EU\) No 965/2012](#)), the European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), acting as competent authority for operators holding an EASA-issued air operator certificate (AOC), has determined that **the type of disruptive schedule applicable to those operators shall be the type of disruptive schedule determined by the related State of the Operator (SoO).**
