Issue: The Maintenance Review Board Report, being a "living document," requires periodic review. This review is today not harmonized through the all industry or properly defined in the IMPS.

Problem: The language in the IMPS is incorrect.

- 1. The title of the "Periodic Review" in the table of contents is incorrectly titled "Annual Review".
- 2. Periodic and annual are separate in their definition. Periodic allows flexibility while in this instance annual seems to imply to establish a set time line. While there may be situations where an annual (or more frequent) review is appropriate, there are also situations and fleets where an annual review is more often than is needed.
- 3. The use of the statement in IMPS section 9.1 and 9.2 "preferably annually" would seem to not be quite right when discussing "periodic" reviews.

Recommendation (including Implementation):

In the IMPS document:

- Modify IMPS 9.1 as follows to better match other parts of the IMPS: The MRBR is intended to be an up-to-date document and, as a consequence, the ISC Chairperson/Co-Chairperson, and the MRB Chairperson should conduct a joint review periodically, preferably annually, to determine the need for revisions.
- 2. Change the word "Annual" to "Periodic" in the table of contents for Section 9.
