DECISION 2014/017/R OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE AGENCY

of 24 April 2014

adopting Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Part-ORO of Regulation (EU) No 965/2012 and repealing Decision 2012/017/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 24 October 2012

'AMC and GM to Part-ORO — Issue 2'

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE EUROPEAN AVIATION SAFETY AGENCY,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 216/2008¹, and in particular Article 38(3)(a) thereof,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 965/2012² and in particular ARO.GEN.120 of Annex II (Part-ARO) thereof,

Whereas:

(1) The Agency shall, pursuant to Article 18(c) of Regulation (EC) No 216/2008, issue Certification Specifications and Acceptable Means of Compliance, as well as Guidance Material for the application of Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 and its Implementing Rules.

- (2) Acceptable Means of Compliance are non-binding standards adopted by the Agency to illustrate means to establish compliance with Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 and its Implementing Rules.
- (3) Guidance Material is non-binding material developed by the Agency that helps to illustrate the meaning of a requirement or specification and is used to support the interpretation of Regulation (EC) No 216/2008, its Implementing Rules, Certification Specifications and Acceptable Means of Compliance.

Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 of the European Parliament and the Council of 20 February 2008 on common rules in the field of civil aviation and establishing a European Aviation Safety Agency, and repealing Council Directive 91/670/EEC, Regulation (EC) No 1592/2002 and Directive 2004/36/EC (OJ L 79, 19.3.2008, p. 1, as last amended by Commission Regulation (EU) No 6/2013 of 8 January 2013 (OJ L 4, 9.1.2013, p. 34).

Regulation (EU) No 965/2012 of the European Commission of 5 October 2012 laying down technical requirements and administrative procedures related to air operations pursuant to Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council (OJ, L 296, 25.10.2012, p.1), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EU) No 379/2014, OJ L 123, 24.4.2014, p. 1

- (4) By Decision 2012/017/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 24 October 2012, the Executive Director adopted Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Part-ORO of Regulation (EU) No 965/2012.
- (5) The Agency shall, pursuant to the 2nd sentence of Article 19(2) of Regulation (EC) No 216/2008, reflect the state of the art and the best practices in the fields concerned and update its decisions taking into account worldwide aircraft experience in service, and scientific and technical progress.
- (6) This Decision provides a consolidated version of the initial AMC/GM and amendments thereto introduced by this Decision, and, therefore, Decision 2012/017/R of the Executive Director of the Agency shall be repealed.
- (7) The Agency, pursuant to Article 52(1)(c) of Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 and Articles 5(3) and 6 and 7 of the Agency's Rulemaking Procedure³, has widely consulted interested parties on the matters which are the subject of this Decision and has provided thereafter a written response to the comments received⁴.

HAS DECIDED:

Article 1

- (1) The Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Annex III (Part-ORO) to Regulation (EU) No 956/2012 are those laid down in the Annex to this Decision.
- (2) Decision 2012/017/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 24 October 2012 on AMC and GM to Part-ORO is hereby repealed.

Article 2

This Decision shall enter into force on the 1st of July 2014.
