DECISION 2013/016/R OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE AGENCY

of 8 August 2013

amending Decision 2011/015/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 15 December 2011 on Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Part-MED¹

'Amendment of the AMC for pilot medical certification (LAPL2)'

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE EUROPEAN AVIATION SAFETY AGENCY,

Having regard to the Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 February 2008, on common rules in the field of civil aviation and establishing a European Aviation Safety Agency³ (hereinafter referred to as 'the Basic Regulation'), in particular Article 38(3)(a) thereof,

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EU) No 1178/2011 of 3 November 2011 laying down technical requirements and administrative procedures related to civil aviation aircrew pursuant to Regulation (EC) No 216/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council⁴, in particular MED.B.095 of Annex IV (Part-MED) thereof.

Whereas:

- (1) The Executive Director issued acceptable means of compliance in the Annex to Decision 2011/015/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 15 December 2011 (Initial Issue).
- (2) The Agency shall, pursuant to Article 18(c) of the Basic Regulation, issue Certification Specifications (SC) and Acceptable Means of Compliance (AMC), as well as Guidance Material(GM) for the application of the Basic Regulation and its implementing rules.

- (3) This Decision provides acceptable means of compliance for the aero-medical assessment of applicants for a LAPL medical certificate who present with a medical history of cancer or with a serious dermatological disease.
- (5) The Agency, pursuant to Article 52(1)(c) of the Basic Regulation and Articles 5(3), 6 and 7(2) of the Rulemaking Procedure⁵ has widely consulted interested parties on the matters which are the subject of this Decision and has provided thereafter a written response to the comments received⁶.

HAS DECIDED:

Article 1

The 'Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Part-MED' of ED Decision 2011/015/R are hereby amended by the Annex to this Decision.

Article 2

This Decision shall enter into force on the day of publication in the Official Publication of the Agency.
