# Issues from the open debate

- EASp implementation – Voluntary vs. Mandatory? – mixed feedback
  - States welcome flexibility to adapt their systems
- Uniformity across Europe
  - Common set of SPIs/expectations?
- Training at various levels – management, inspectors.
  - European regulatory professional mentoring
