# How to get to EASA

- EASA's Headquarters ("EASA Direktion") are located in the centre of Cologne, at the west bank of the river Rhine, close to Cologne Central Station ("Köln Hauptbahnhof").

# How to get to EASA

## → From Köln-Bonn Airport (CGN)

### → By train

- Take the train S13 (S-Bahn) to "Köln-Hauptbahnhof" (Central Station)
- There is a train from the airport every 20-30 minutes and costs approximately €7,50
- The train takes about 15 minutes after leaving the airport
- Leave the Central Station via the exits near platforms 10-11, cross the area of the "Breslauer Platz" towards the traffic circle and continue on "Goldgasse" left of the Musical Dome
- The "EASA Direktion" is located directly to your left and the main entrance is in the center area of the building facing the river Rhine

### → By taxi

The trip takes about 25 minutes and costs around €40.





# How to get to EASA

## → From Düsseldorf Airport (DUS)

### → By train

- The “SkyTrain” connects the Düsseldorf airport with the train station “Flughafen Bahnhof”
- Take the RE (Regionalexpress) to “Köln-Hauptbahnhof”
- There is a RE train every 20 - 40 minutes
- The journey takes about 40 minutes and costs approximately €25
- Leave the Central Station via the exits near platforms 10-11, cross the area of the “Breslauer Platz” towards the traffic circle and continue on “Goldgasse” left of the Musical Dome
- The “EASA Direktion” is located directly to your left and the main entrance is in the center area of the building facing the river Rhine

### → By taxi

The trip takes about 40 minutes and costs around €120



# How to get to EASA

## → From Frankfurt Airport (FRA)

### → By train

- The train station “Frankfurt Flughafen” is directly at the airport “AIRail Terminal”
  - Take the ICE (Intercity Express) train to “Köln-Hauptbahnhof”
  - There is an ICE train from the airport every 30 minutes
  - The journey takes about 1 hour and costs approximately €40-60
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- Leave the Central Station via the exits near platforms 10-11, cross the area of the “Breslauer Platz” towards the traffic circle and continue on “Goldgasse” left of the Musical Dome
  - The “EASA Direktion” is located directly to your left and the main entrance is in the center area of the building facing the river Rhine

# General information

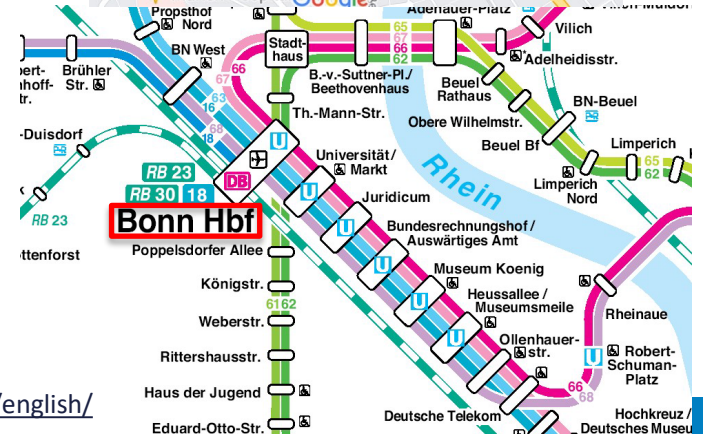
- Located approx. 40 Km south of Cologne

# Maybe you don't know that...



## It's the former capital of Germany

In 1949, after the end of the Second World War, the West German parliament declared Bonn to be the capital of the Federal Republic, while Berlin served as the capital of East Germany. The German reunification in 1990 ignited a heated debate that ultimately resulted in Berlin being named the capital of Germany the following year. Bonn remained the seat of the government until 1999 when the move was completed, but it is still home to some ministries and federal officials. The current administration is still using the former Chancellor and President residences.



## It's the birthplace of Beethoven

Bonn is the birthplace of Ludwig van Beethoven, Germany's greatest composer whose symphonies still enchant those who appreciate classical music. The Beethoven family home at Bonngasse 20 and the neighboring buildings have been converted into the Beethoven House, a museum and memorial site of the late composer. Visitors can explore an archive of his works, a chamber music hall and the permanent exhibition that depicts Beethoven's life in the city.

## Taste award-winning red wines

Bonn is the gateway to one of Germany's most important wine regions. The Ahrtal centers around the town of Bad Neuenahr and is known for its steep terraced vineyards where the winemakers of the valley primarily cultivate Pinot Noir and Portugais Bleu grapes. Picturesque hiking trails connect vineyards with one another, and you can stop along the way for wine tastings and tours of the estates.



## It's a candy paradise

Have you ever wondered where your favorite gummy bears come from? The short answer is Bonn. HARIBO is short for Hans Riegel Bonn, the founder of the jelly candy that has sweetened the lives of generations. The company was founded in 1920, but it wasn't until the 80s when the candy headed across the pond and made its rounds in the US. If you visit Bonn, you can explore the factory outlet on Bad Godesberg and stock up on your favorite kind.

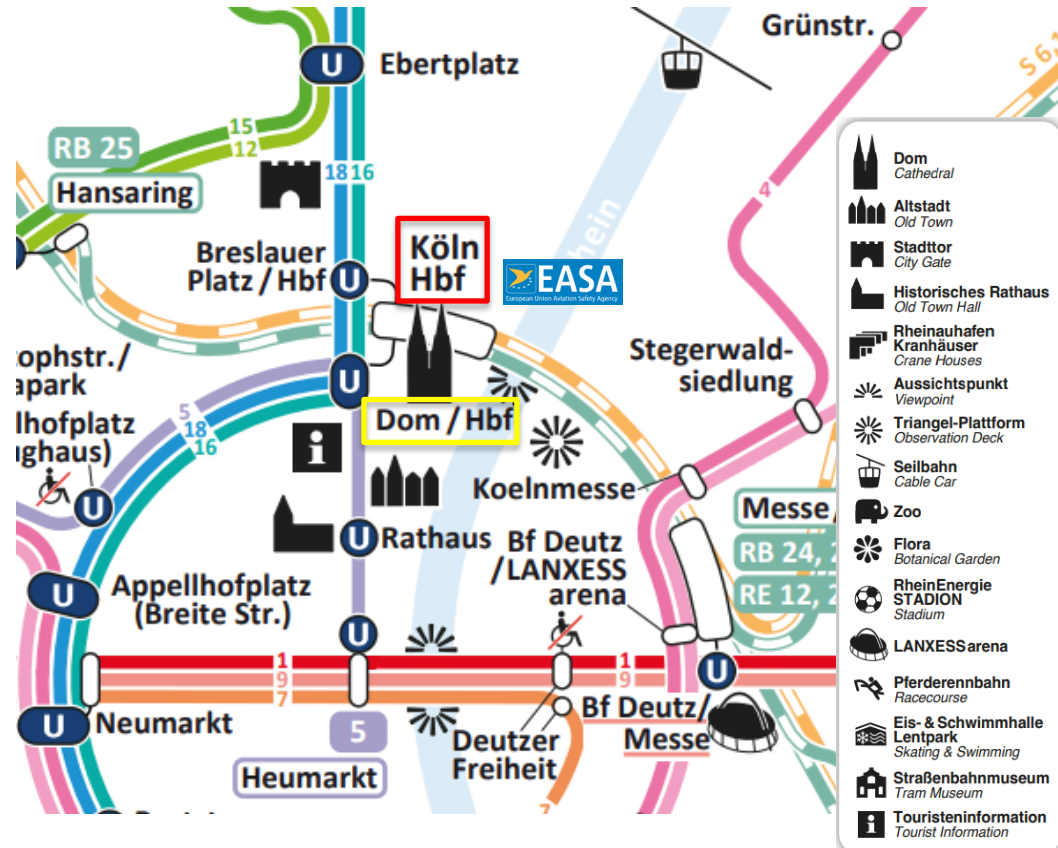

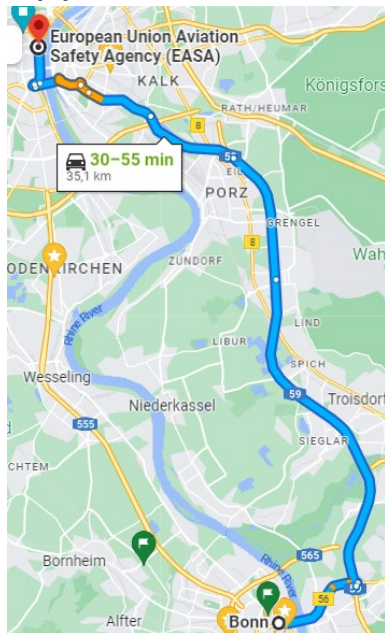

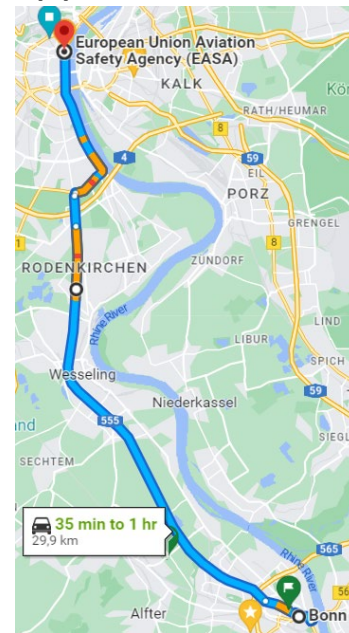
