EASA General Aviation Road Map – to establish simpler and proportionate rules for balloons

Balloon Regulation

- RMT.0674 OPS balloons finalised
 - Regulation 2018/395 of 13 March 2018
 - EASA Decision 2018/004/R of 23 March 2018
 - Both applicable from 8 April 2019
- RMT.0654 FCL balloons work in progress



The past


- Reg. 965/2012 and 'associated material' (AMC/GM)
 About 1900 pages
- For balloons
 About 120 pages apply
 But spread over the 1900 pages

The way forward

- ➤ Rules extracted from Reg. 965/2012
- Separate Balloon Regulation



Balloon Regulation



BOP = <u>B</u>alloon Air <u>Op</u>erations

BFCL = <u>B</u>alloon <u>F</u>light <u>Crew Licensing</u>



Air operations – major topics

Commercial operations

Declaration scheme (no AOC)

Cost-shared operations

- Limited to 4 persons
- Sharing of direct and annual costs

> Aerial advertising flights, news media and movie flights


Not considered as specialised operations, but as normal operations
 No risk assessment and checklist needed

Balloon authority requirements

- To remain in Part-ARO of Reg. 965/2012
 - >> To have all OPS authority requirements under 'one roof'



Balloon Rule Book



 - ► Chapter 3 Continuing airworthiness
 - Reserved Part-M Light with the Commission
 - > Chapter 4 Initial airworthiness
 - CS-31GB, CS-31HB and CS-31TGB
