

Existing pilot licences and national medical certificates

- Part-FCL licences: full ,grandfathering'
- National licences:
 - ➤ Valid until 8 April 2021
 - ➤ Conversion report → Part-SFCL licence
- National medical certificates: valid until they expire or until 8 April 2021 (whichever earlier), revalidation in accordance with Part-MED



- New definition: "TMG"

Specific class of powered sailplane that

- (a) has an integrally mounted, non-retractable engine and a non-retractable propeller and is capable of taking off and climbing under its own power according to its flight manual; or
- (b) notwithstanding point (a), is classified as TMG in the operational suitability data established in accordance with Annex I (Part-21) to Regulation (EU) No 748/2012;





- Authority designated by a Member State for issuing SPLs
- ➤ Modelled on Part-FCL, point FCL.001, tailored to sailplanes

Kinds of sailplanes

- Explanation of the meaning of the term "sailplanes" in terms of Part-SFCL
- Powered sailplanes and TMGs included, unless specified otherwise

 - Personal identification document
 - Sufficient log book data (for demonstration of compliance with recency requirements)
 - > Student pilots: Evidence of authorisation for solo flight
 - Modelled on Part-FCL, point FCL.045

- Obligation to carry and present documents
 - New point (d): Documents listed in points (a) and (b) may be retained at the aerodrome for flights
 - Remaining within the sight of aerodrome / operating site
 - Remaining within a distance from aerodrome / operating site determined by the competent authority

- Detailed records of all flights to be kept
- Form and manner of records as established by the competent authority (AMC: pilot's logbook)
- Modelled on Part-FCL, point FCL.050

- Curtailment of privileges of BPL holders aged 70 or more in commercial passenger sailplane operations
 - SPL holders having attained 70 years: excluded from commercial sailplane passenger operations

Subpart GEN

- Revocation, suspension and limitation of licences, privileges, ratings and certificates
 - In case of non-compliances with
 - Essential requirements of the Basic Regulation*
 - Part-BFCL
 - Part-MED
 - Operational requirements (e.g. Part-SAO)

- **▶** SPL Student pilots
 - Solo flights only with authorisation from an FI
 - Before first solo: be at least 14 years of age
 - Modelled on Part-FCL, point FCL.020

Subpart SPL

- **➤** SPL Training course and experience requirements
 - Training requirements (identical to Part-FCL, point FCL.110.S)
 - Theoretical knowledge instruction
 - ▶ 15 hours of flight instruction
 - 10 hours of dual flight instruction
 - 2 hours of supervised solo flight time
 - 45 launches or take of & landings; and
 - 1 solo cross-country flight (27 NM) or 1 dual crosscountry flight (55 NM)

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Training course and experience requirements
 - Training requirements (identical to Part-FCL, point FCL.110.S)
 - ➤ For obtaining TMG privileges → include training elements as specified in point SFCL.135 (b)(1)(i)
 - 4 hours of dual instruction
 - 1 solo cross-country flight (80 NM)
 - Credits for holders of licences for other aircraft categories
 - ▶ 10 % of total flight experience, max. 7 hours
 - Credit towards dual instruction time only

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Theoretical knowledge examination
 - Common subjects:
 - air law, human performance, meteorology, communications
 - Specific subjects:
 - Principles of flight, operational procedures, flight performance and planning, aircraft general knowledge, navigation

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Theoretical knowledge examination
 - All exams at one competent authority
 - Examination only after recommendation from ATO/DTO
 - Pass standards (75 % per paper)
 - Validity period of passed examination: 24 months
 - Modelled on Part-FCL, points FCL.025 and FCL.215

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Crediting of theoretical knowledge
 - Holders of Part-FCL or Part-BFCL licences receive full credit for the common subjects:
 - air law
 - human performance
 - meteorology
 - communications
 - Modelled on Appendix 1 to Part-FCL

Subpart SPL

- SPL Practical skill test
 - Demonstration of ability to be pilot-in-command (PIC)
 - Aircraft to be used: Sailplane or TMG, depending from the training content
 - Theoretical knowlege examinations before skill test
 - Pass standards
 - ➤ Modelled on Part-FCL, points FCL.030 (a) and FCL.235

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Sailplane and TMG privileges
 - Licence privileges limited to aircraft used for skill test:
 - Sailplanes, excluding TMGs; or
 - **➤** TMGs
 - ➤ Limitation to sailplane → extension to TMG
 - ➤ 6 hours of flight instruction at ATO/DTO
 - 4 hours of dual flight instruction
 - 1 solo cross-country flight (80 NM)
 - Skill test (with oral theory exam)
 - Credits for TMG class rating holders

Subpart SPL

- > SPL Sailplane and TMG privileges
 - ➤ Limitation to TMG → extension to sailplanes
 - 7 hours of flight instruction at ATO/DTO
 - 3 hours of dual flight instruction
 - 2 hours supervised solo flight time
 - 15 launches and landings
 - 1 solo cross-country flight (27 NM) or one dual crosscountry flight (55)
 - Skill test (with oral theory exam)

Launching methods

- Licence privileges limited to launching method used during skill test
- Extension to other launching methods after relevant flight instruction
 - ➤ Winch launch / car launch : 10 dual / 5 solo launches
 - Aero-tow / self-launch: 5 dual / 5 solo launches
 - Bungee launch: 3 dual or solo launches
- Recency: 2 (bungee) or 5 (all other) launches in 2 years
- Renewal: Complete recency requirements with FI

 - TMG privileges: credits for holders of TMG class rating in accordance with Part-FCL
 - Condition: 3 hours as PIC & 6 take-offs and landings on TMG during last 2 years
 - ➤ In case of non-compliance with recency requirements:
 - Proficiency check; or
 - perform additional flight time with FI

Subpart SPL

- **>>** SPL − Recency requirements
 - Carriage of passengers
 - > Flight experience completed in the preceding 90 days:
 - 3 launches in sailplanes, excluding TMGs (in case of passenger flight with sailplane, excluding TMGs); or
 - 2 take-offs / landings in TMG (in case of passenger flight with TMG)
 - 1 take-off / landing in TMG at night (in case of passenger flight in TMG at night)

 - Sailplanes, powered sailplanes, TMGs
 - Extension to motor-powered aerobatic flight in "sailplanes with engine power" possible
- Prerequisites
 - 120 launches as PIC

- Aerobatic rating
 - Training course at ATO/DTO
 - Theoretical knowledge instruction
 - Basic aerobatic rating
 - 45 degree climbing and diving lines
 - Loops
 - Wing over
 - Advanced aerobatic rating
 - > 5 hours or 20 flights of aerobatic flight instruction

Aerobatic rating

➤ Full credit towards point SFCL.200 training requirements for holders of a Part-FCL licence for aeroplanes with TMG aerobatic privileges

 - 30 hours PIC in TMGs

 - ➤ For pilots with TMG restriction: 5 familiarisation flights in a sailplane lauched by an aircraft.

 - 3 dual training flights
 - Recency requirements
 - 5 tows during last 2 years

 - VFR flights at night in TMGs

 - Theoretical knowledge instruction
 - 5 hours in TMG at night
 - 3 hours dual instruction

 - 5 solo full-stop landings
 - Basic instrument flight training module (Part-FCL)

 - > Full credit for holders of a Part-FCL night rating (point FCL.810)

 - Operation within clouds "when any engine is stopped"
 - Prerequisites
 - 30 hours PIC in sailplanes
 - Training course
 - Theoretical knowledge instruction
 - 2 hours dual flight instruction
 - No skill test

Sailplane cloud flying rating

- Crediting for holders of an IR(A) or EIR
 - Full credit for theoretical knowledge instruction
 - 1 hour flight instruction necessary
- Recency requirements
 - ▶ 1 hour or 5 flights exercising SCF privileges in 2 years
 - Missing hours/flights to be completed with FI; alternatively: proficiency check with FE
 - Full credit for IR(A) or EIR holders

 - Additional launching methods
 - Minimum experience aero-tow launch: 30 launches

 - List of core competencies for instructors
 - Modelled on Part-FCL, point FCL.920

- ➤ FI(S) Training course
 - Pre-entry course assessment (Part-FCL: "flight test")
 - Content up to the ATO/DTO, assessment flight not compulsory, to take place within 12 months prior to the course start (Part-FCL: flight test within 6 months)
 - 25 hours of teaching and learning
 - 30 hours of theoretical knowledge instruction
 - 6 hours or 20 launches of flight instruction (on sailplanes, excluding TMGs)
 - For TMG instructional privileges: additional 6 hours on TMG

- No privileges to authorise student pilots for first solo flights
- Restriction to be lifted when FI(S) has completed
 - ▶ 15 hours or 50 launches of flight instruction (covering the full SPL syllabus)
 - For FI who completed TMG training during FI course: 5 out of 15 hours and 15 out of 50 launches may be done in TMGs

Limitation in the case of vested interests

Specific question / proposal: Change from 25% to 50% (permitted involvement of examiner in training)

- Conduct of skill tests, prof checks & AoC
 - Obligations of examiners before and after the skill test / prof check / AoC
 - Record-keeping: for 5 years after skill test / prof check / AoC
 - Obligation to present records to the competent authority

 - One test/check/AoC under supervision of senior examiner / inspector
 - Combined revalidation with other examiner certificates (Part-FCL, Part-BFCL) after agreement with competent authority*

Amendments to Annex I (Part-FCL) and IV (Part-MED) to Regulation (EU) No 1178/2011

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> FCL.800 Aerobatic rating

- > Changes in the context of deletion of sailplane content
- Reworded to clarify that the FCL.800 rating is for aerobatic flights with
 - Aeroplanes
 - TMGs flown with engine power
- Prerequisite: Reduction from 40 to 30 PIC hours (Opinion No 05/2017)
- Privileges restricted (based on training received) to
 - Aeroplanes; or
 - TMGs flown with engine power
- Removal of restriction: 3 training flights in the other category



> FCL.800 Aerobatic rating

- Credits for holders of an advanced aerobatic rating for TMGs flown with engine power (point SFCL.200 (c)) (new point FCL.800 (d))
 - Complete training in accordance with point FCL.800 on aeroplanes, not followed by restriction to aeroplanes
 - ➤ Receive full credit for the issue of a Part-FCL aerobatic rating restricted to TMGs flown with engine power



MED.A.030 Medical certificates

- (c) When exercising the privileges of a:
 - (1) **light aircraft pilot licence (LAPL)**, the pilot shall hold at least a **valid LAPL medical certificate**;
 - (2) private pilot licence (PPL), a sailplane pilot licence (SPL) or a balloon pilot licence (BPL), the pilot shall hold at least a valid class 2 medical certificate;
 - (3) SPL or a **BPL involved in commercial** sailplane or **balloon flights**, the pilot shall hold at least a valid **class 2 medical certificate**;



MED.A.030 (Proposed amendments)

- (c) When exercising the privileges of a:
 - (1) light aircraft pilot licence (LAPL), a sailplane pilot licence (SPL) or a balloon pilot licence (BPL), the pilot shall hold at least a valid LAPL medical certificate;
 - (2) private pilot licence (PPL), the pilot shall hold at least a valid class 2 medical certificate;
 - (3) **SPL** or a BPL involved in **commercial sailplane** or balloon **flights**

, the pilot shall hold at least a valid class 2 medical certificate;
