Air operations

The past


- ➤ Reg. 965/2012 and 'associated material' (AMC/GM)
 - ➤ About 1900 pages
- ➤ For sailplanes
 - ➤ About 100 pages apply
 - ▶ But spread over the 1900 pages

The way forward

- ➤ Rules extracted from Reg. 965/2012
- ➤ Separate Sailplane Regulation


Air operations – EASA proposals on major topics

Commercial operations

- ➤ No additional rules, except for requiring a Declaration
- **➤** Sailplane towing, competition and aerobatic flights
 - ➤ Not considered as specialised operations, but as normal operations
 - No risk assessment and checklist needed
- Sailplane authority requirements
 - To remain in Part-ARO of Reg. 965/2012
 - > To have all OPS authority requirements under 'one roof'



Sailplane Rule Book (planned)



- Easy access and easy-to-read
- Consolidated versions
- ➤ All a pilot needs to know

- ➤ Chapter 3 Continuing airworthiness
 - Part-M Light with the Commission

 - ➤ CS-22 already exists
