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THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AVIATION SAFETY AGENCY (EASA),

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2018/1139¹, and in particular Articles 76(3) and 104(3)(a) thereof,

Whereas:

Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 4 July 2018 on common rules in the field of civil aviation and establishing a European Union Aviation Safety Agency, and amending Regulations (EC) No 2111/2005, (EC) No 1008/2008, (EU) No 996/2010, (EU) No 376/2014 and Directives 2014/30/EU and 2014/53/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council, and repealing Regulations (EC) No 552/2004 and (EC) No 216/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council and Council Regulation (EEC) No 3922/91 (OJ L 212, 22.8.2018, p. 1) (http://data.europa.eu/eli/reg/2018/1139/oj).



- (1) Acceptable means of compliance (AMC) are non-binding standards issued by EASA, which are used by persons and organisations to demonstrate compliance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and with the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof.
- (2) Guidance material (GM) is non-binding material issued by EASA, which helps to illustrate the meaning of delegated or implementing acts, and which is used to support the interpretation of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, and of the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof.
- (3) EASA shall, pursuant to Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, reflect the state of the art and the best practices in the field of aviation, taking into account worldwide aviation experience and scientific and technical progress in the respective fields.
- (4) Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/20² lays down requirements for the safe provision of ground handling services and for organisations providing them.

In this context, EASA has identified the need to issue a new set of AMC and GM to facilitate the implementation of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/20.

- (5) EASA, pursuant to Article 115(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and Article 6 of the EASA Rulemaking Procedure³, widely consulted the interested parties on the content of this Decision in 2022 and prepared the AMC and GM taking into consideration the comments received through the consultation⁴.
- (6) EASA, pursuant to Article 115(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and Article 6 of the EASA Rulemaking Procedure, consulted its Advisory Bodies in 2023 on the content of this Decision and considered the comments received,

HAS DECIDED:

Article 1

The AMC and GM to the Articles of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/20 are laid down in Annex I to this Decision.

Article 2

The AMC and GM to Annex I (Part-ORGH) to Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/20 are laid down in Annex II to this Decision.

Article 3

The AMC and GM to Annex II (Part-GH.OPS) to Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/20 are laid down in Annex III to this Decision.

Article 4

This Decision shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the *Official Publication* of EASA.

It shall apply from 27 March 2028.
