On arrival, visitors are kindly requested to register at the reception.



## From Brussels Airport (BRU) 12

### By bus (STIB/MTVB)

Take the Airport Line #12 and get off at “Schuman”. From “Rue Franklin”, where the bus stops, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, on your left take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. From the bus stop, it takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

*Update May 2024:* due to the ongoing work at the Schuman roundabout, 12 bus stops at

- rue Franklin, 2a (direction Brussels City)
- rue Archimède, 14 (direction Brussels Airport)

*The Airport Line is a daily 30-minute express service between Brussels Airport and the European district. Timetables are available [here](#). Departure from the Airport is on level 0 – platform C.*

*Price for one-way journey: 7,00 € (MOBIB card or contactless) or 7,50 € at the vending machine for paper ticket. More information can be found at <http://www.stib-mivb.be/airport-line.html?l=en>*

### By train (SNCB) B

Take the direct train to the Bruxelles-Schuman station. When leaving the train station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

*On weekdays 2 trains per hour run to and from the European district (Schumann station)*

*The trip takes around 20 minutes and a one-way ticket costs 10,80 Euro.*

*Brussels Airport-Zaventem station is located on level -1. More information available at <http://www.belgianrail.be>*

### By taxi

Licensed taxis are permanently available in front of the arrival hall, these can be recognized by the blue and yellow emblem. The trip from the airport to the EASA Brussels office takes around 30 minutes (depending on traffic) and the fare is normally around € 45.

## From Brussels Midi Station (arrival terminal for Thalys and Eurostar)

### By metro (STIB/MTVB) 1 5

Take the metro lines 2 or 6 with destination “Simonis (Elizabeth)” and stop at “Art-Loi” (6 stops). From there you can take metro lines 1 to “Stockel” or 5 to “Herrmann-Debroux”, and stop at “Schuman” (2 stops). When leaving the metro station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

*Single one-way journey fare: € 2,40 (JUMP)*

*BRUPASS a Day: € 8,40*

*10 journey pass: € 16,80*

### By taxi

Licensed taxis are permanently available outside the Station. These can be recognized by the blue and yellow emblem. The trip from Gare du Midi to the EASA Brussels office takes around 20 minutes (depending on traffic) and the fare is normally around € 25.

## From Brussels Central Station (Gare Centrale):

### By metro (STIB/MTVB)

Take the metro lines 1 to “Stockel” or 5 to “Herrmann-Debroux”, and stop at “Schuman” (4 stops). When leaving the metro station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

*Single one-way journey fare: € 2,40 (JUMP)*

*BRUPASS a Day: € 8,40*

*10 journey pass: € 16,80*
