2 - AT LOCAL SPORTING EVENT



You have invested in a new drone as way of capturing personal activities and memories for your own use, as well as to share with members of your immediate family. You plan to attend the first ever football match of your child, nephew or relative, which is held on the local school football field.

Before attending the match, you verify with the competent authorities whether the use of a drone to record such event is allowed in your country. If necessary, you ask for a special permission.

During the game, you operate the drone to record audio and visual footage. You also use the zoom lens to film the child in action during the match. At some point, another parent attending the match asks you not to capture any footage of their child or themselves. Despite this, you continue filming as it is impossible for you to record the game without capturing the other children.

Privacy of location or space: The parents of another child have specifically requested for them and their child not to be filmed. Continuing to film/ record them potentially infringes their privacy right to move and behave freely, unobserved, especially as this may be considered a semi-private event because it is held on the local school grounds.

TIPS - *Before using a drone, consider your surroundings and the impact of your operation on others. To avoid any problem, always ask people for permission before taking any picture or video that includes them. Where possible, respond to any questions from others about your drone use.*

Privacy of association: By filming the children playing football, you may be impacting the other individuals' right to freedom of association. This risk is especially relevant because there is just a small group of people attending and the size of the football grounds makes capturing film and sound recording of others "unavoidable".
