The EASA Brussels Office is located a few minutes' walk from the Schuman roundabout.

On arrival, visitors are kindly requested to register at the reception.



From Brussels Airport (BRU)

By bus

Take the Airport Line and get off at “Schuman”. From “Rue Archimede”, where the bus stops, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, then cross the street on your left and take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. From the bus stop, it takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

The Airport Line is a 30-minute express service between Brussels Airport and the European district. Departure from the Airport is on level 0 – platform C. From Monday to Friday till 8 pm the Airport Line is operated as an express service under number “12” and only serves the major stops. On weekdays after 8 pm, on week-ends and holidays, the Airport Line is operated as a regular service with number “21”, serving all stops. The bus station is located on level 0 and the Airport Line departs from platform “C”.

Price for one journey (one way): advance purchase from the vending machine 4,50 € or 6,00 € from the bus driver. Vending machines are available both at Brussels Airport and Schuman, where the Airport Line bus departs. More information can be found at <http://www.stib-mivb.be/airport-line.html?l=en>

By train

Take the direct train to the Bruxelles-Schuman station. When leaving the train station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

The trip takes around 25 minutes and a one-way ticket costs 8,70 Euro. Brussels Airport-Zaventem station is located on level -1. More information available at <http://www.belgianrail.be>

By taxi

Licensed taxis are permanently available in front of the arrivals hall, these can be recognized by the blue and yellow emblem. The trip from the airport to the EASA Brussels office takes around 30 minutes (depending on traffic) and the fare is normally around € 45.

From Brussels Midi Station (arrival terminal for Thalys and Eurostar)

By metro (STIB)

Take the metro lines 2 or 6 with destination “Simonis (Elizabeth)” and stop at “Art-Loi” (6 stops). From there you can take metro lines 1 to “Stockel” or 5 to “Herrmann-Debroux”, and stop at “Schuman” (2 stops). When leaving the metro station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

Single one-way journey fare: € 2,10 (JUMP)

By taxi

Licensed taxis are permanently available outside the Station. These can be recognized by the blue and yellow emblem. The trip from Gare du Midi to the EASA Brussels office takes around 20 minutes (depending on traffic) and the fare is normally around € 20.

From Brussels Central Station (Gare Centrale):

By metro (STIB)

Take the metro lines 1 to “Stockel” or 5 to “Herrmann-Debroux”, and stop at “Schuman” (4 stops). When leaving the metro station, walk up to the Schuman roundabout, and then take “Avenue Cortenbergh”. It takes 5/10 minutes to reach the EASA Brussels office.

Single one-way journey fare: € 2,10 (JUMP)
