PRIVACY STATEMENT

1. What personal data do we collect?

EASA processes from the ANP Database Users the following personal data:

- First Name
- Last Name
- Job Title
- Organization
- Email address

2. For what purpose do we collect personal data and on which legal basis?

The purpose of the personal data processing is to enable EASA to create a database (ANP Database) and to distribute in accordance with Regulation (EU) No 598/2014¹ aircraft noise and performance information for noise modelling purposes to the parties described in Article 7(3) and Article 7(6) of Regulation (EU) No 598/2014.

The legal basis and necessity for the processing of personal data is laid down in Article 5(1) (a) of the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725² and Article 7(3) of Regulation (EU) No 598/2014.

3. Who may receive your personal data?

Your personal data will be processed by EASA staff who are tasked as part of their responsibilities to manage the distribution of aircraft noise and performance (ANP) information, without prejudice to a possible transfer to bodies in charge of a monitoring, auditing or inspection function in accordance with European Union legislation.





4. How long are your personal data kept?

Personal data collected is kept for 10 years after its receipt by the Agency. After that period, the personal data is deleted.

5. What are your rights?

You have the right to request from EASA access to and rectification or erasure of your personal data or restriction of processing. You also have the right to object to processing of your personal data.

EASA should provide information on action taken on a request within one month of receipt of the request. That period may be extended by two further months where necessary, taking into account the complexity and number of the requests.

A breach concerning your personal data should be communicated to you under certain circumstances. EASA should also ensure the confidentiality of electronic communications.

6. Who is the data controller and how to exercise your rights?

EASA should exercise the tasks of the data controller for the purpose of these processing operations.
