WP 4: Competency Development: "Training for Airworthiness Inspectors"



The Eastern Partnership and Central Asia Project (EaP/CA) organised an eight day training course for Airworthiness Inspectors. This activity was delivered in Yerevan, Armenia from 29 May to 07 June 2018.

This course was delivered at such level that it was suitable for new Airworthiness Inspectors, moving into their first roles within the CAA, and also as a refresher for those who have been in their role for some time, and needed to ensure currency.

This course demonstrated how Airworthiness and Safety Regulation is controlled and provided an overview of the processes and procedures used by regulators to ensure

that individuals, manufacturers, operators and maintenance organisations comply with the relevant airworthiness regulations, setting this work in the international context established by ICAO and EASA. This course also provided an introduction to the EASA regulatory system to support the states in their familiarisation with EASA regulations.

The training was conducted in the form of classroom working sessions and contained eighteen modules. It included PowerPoint presentations, case studies, group exercises and group discussions, and provided the theoretical and practical knowledge required by Airworthiness Inspectors in the CAA.

The training was attended by a group of eleven experts from the CAA of Armenia, Belarus, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan.
