WP 4: Competency Development Aircrew Licencing Training course

Within the technical activities of the Eastern Partnership and Central Asia Project (EaP/CA), a 5-day specific training on Air Crew Requirements was delivered in Chisinau, Moldova, between the 7th and 11th of May 2018.

The training course covered the Air Crew requirements, more specifically:

- EC Regulation 216/2008 - Basic Regulation
- EU Regulation 628/2013 - EASA working methods inspections/monitoring
- EU Regulation 1178/2011 - Air Crew

The objective of this training was to familiarize the participants with the relevant parts of the 3 regulations covered and to provide a more thorough understanding of the topics that are especially relevant for Inspectors.

Moreover, the activity was developed in order to build the participants' capacities in the following areas:

- Understand the role of a Competent Authority Inspector;
- Identify and justify findings with regard to Air Crew according to the European regulatory framework;
- Understand the roles of the European Union, EASA and the Member States;
- Understand relevant licensing requirements;
- Understand the role of an Approved Training Organization;

The training was constructed as a classroom working session including PowerPoint presentations, case studies, group exercises and group discussions, providing both the theoretical knowledge, and the practical context to underpin the delegates learning. Seven experts from the Civil Aviation Authorities of Armenia, Azerbaijan, Republic of Moldova und Ukraine attended the course.
