Amendment 3 to Issue 1 of the Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/947

'AMC and GM to Regulation (EU) 2019/947 — Issue 1, Amendment 3'

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AVIATION SAFETY AGENCY (EASA),

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2018/11391, and in particular Articles 76(3) and 104(3)(a) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Acceptable means of compliance are non-binding standards issued by EASA, which are used by persons and organisations to show compliance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and with the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof, or with the certification specifications and detailed specifications.
- (2) Guidance material is non-binding material issued by EASA, which helps to illustrate the meaning of delegated or implementing acts or certification specifications and detailed specifications, and which is used to support the interpretation of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, of the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof, and of certification specifications and detailed specifications.
- (3) With Decision 2019/021/R² of 9 October 2019, the Executive Director issued Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/947³.

- (4) EASA shall, pursuant to Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, reflect the state of the art and the best practices in the field of aviation and update its Decisions, taking into account worldwide aviation experience and scientific and technical progress in the respective fields.
 - Based on stakeholder input received through the public consultation of NPA 2021-09⁴, EASA issued Decision 2022/002/R to address the most urgent topics, while more time was required to improve the text of the acceptable means of compliance and guidance material proposed in NPA 2021-09 related to the design verification process for the unmanned aircraft systems classified in the medium risk of the 'specific' category and the extension of the applicability of PDRA S-01. These acceptable means of compliance and guidance material are issued with the present Decision.
- (5) EASA, pursuant to Article 115(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and Article 6 of the EASA Rulemaking Procedure⁵, has widely consulted the interested parties on the content of this Decision. A written response to the comments⁶ received will be provided at a later stage,

HAS DECIDED:

Article 1

Annex I to Decision 2019/021/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 9 October 2019 is amended as laid down in the Annex to this Decision.

Article 2

This Decision shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the Official Publication of EASA.
