Background: EASA Type Certificate EASA.A.064, Issue 3 concerns the following aircraft models:

The request by Airbus of 13 September 2013 to surrender EASA Type Certificate No. EASA.A.064, with regard to the A320-111 aircraft model, has been accepted by EASA.

In accordance with the applicable EASA administrative procedures², the proposal to surrender the Type Certificate related to A320-111 aircraft model was published on the EASA website for public consultation under EASA Certification Information 2014 – 03 dated 21 February, 2014. There were no comments made to the public consultation and therefore EASA decided to accept the surrender of the aforementioned Type Certificate for the A320-111 aircraft model. EASA has

submitted the decision to revoke Type Certificate No. EASA.A.064 to the Type Certificate Holder on 25 March 2014.

Consequence: Regarding the continuation of aircraft models A318-111, A318-112, A318-121, A318-122, A319-111, A319-112, A319-113, A319-114, A319-115, A319-131, A319-132, A319-133, A320-211, A320-212, A320-214, A320-215, A320-216, A320-231, A320-232, A320-233, A321-111, A321-112, A321-131, A321-211, A321-212, A321-213, A321-231, A321-232, which were also covered under EASA Type Certificate EASA.A.064, EASA has re-issued EASA Type Certificate No. EASA.A.064 at Issue 4, dated 21 March 2014. In relation to the A320-111 aircraft model, any aircraft registered in an EU Member State will no longer be eligible for a normal Certificate of Airworthiness according to Article 5(c) of Regulation (EC) No. 216/2008³.

For aircraft registered outside the EU, operators should contact their State of Registry for a decision on the continuing validity of any certificates they have issued.
